- Candidate status must be eighth grade level at the time of application.
- Candidates must submit copies of most recent report card and final seventh grade report card.

Essay Question

Candidates must submit a 300 word essay answering the following question: **Why would you be a value added member of the Shrine Catholic Community? Please explain and cite examples.**

Recommendation letter: Candidates should have two letters of recommendation submitted on their behalf. One can be completed by a teacher, counselor or principal but one must be an outside source such as a coach, pastor, employer, scout leader or club moderator. If you already have a letter of recommendation on file with the Admissions Office, it is only necessary to have one additional letter submitted.

Other:

- Final candidates may be called for an interview at the discretion of the selection committee.
- Families must complete a FACTS Grant & Aid application.

Connie Kramer Level '61 Memorial Scholarship

Connie Kramer Level was a 1961 graduate of Shrine Catholic High School. During her time at Shrine, Connie was involved in many extracurriculars, including choir, orchestra, glee club, pep club, yearbook and intramural basketball. It is in following her spirit of being a true Shrine Knight, that her husband has established a scholarship in her memory.

Mrs. Level raised two daughters with her husband Leon and was a proud grandmother of three. Throughout her life, she remained devoted to her Catholic faith, attending Marygrove College and later becoming an active parishioner at her church, St. Lawrence Martyr Catholic Church. Mrs. Level also held firm in her devotion to the arts and was a member of the board of trustees for the Autry National Center, a museum dedicated to all aspects of American West fine and performing arts.

The family of Connie Level Kramer honors the memory of Connie, her Shrine education and Catholic faith, by establishing this scholarship. This scholarship will be awarded to one registered member of Shrine Catholic High School for the 2020-2021 school year, with preference given to those exhibiting outstanding vocal ability and/or involvement with the yearbook as an extracurricular activity, Christian values, strong intellectual capability, strong work ethic and personal integrity. The scholarship is funded by Leon J. Level, in loving memory of his wife Connie Kramer Level '61.

1. Have a minimum B average G.P.A.
2. Demonstrated need for financial assistance to attend Shrine Catholic High School.
3. Demonstrated involvement in extra-curricular activities or volunteer service.
4. Show potential to succeed in a college preparatory curriculum.

This is a one year scholarship for tuition at Shrine Catholic High School. There will be an application process each year where one student is chosen to receive the scholarship. The exact dollar amount of the scholarship will vary each year based on the financial need status of the student chosen and the tuition cost of attending Shrine High School.

Once financial need is determined, the National Shrine Knights of Columbus Council will select the recipient on behalf of the Ward Family. Additionally, the National Shrine K of C Council is supporting the Ward Memorial Scholarship by awarding a \$250 scholarship to a second student based on the same criteria.

JAMES HARBOUR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

James Harbour was an automotive executive, holding many different senior positions in accounting, finance and manufacturing over 30 years. He retired from Chrysler in 1980 and started his own manufacturing consulting business, where he became known for leading the charge to improve labor productivity in the automotive OEM manufacturing plants. In 1981, he published The Harbour Report, which quickly became the industry scorecard for efficiency in automotive OEM manufacturing operations and challenged the industry to improve. Many in the industry have stated that he single handedly changed automotive manufacturing. Jim led Harbour & Associates, Inc. until 1999 when he formally retired.

Jim and his wife Dolores were the proud parents of eight children, many who attended and graduated from Shrine Catholic Schools. In creating this scholarship in their dad's memory, the Harbour family looks to recognize a student with a demonstrated interest in the S.T.E.M. field.

"What I learned from my father is the world owes you nothing. You have to work for it. He lived that."

Recipients of the James Harbour Memorial Scholarship should meet the following criteria:

1. A registered member of Shrine Catholic High School for the 2020-2021 school year (incoming 9th through 12th grade students)
2. Have submitted the application for the James Harbour Memorial Scholarship
3. Have demonstrated interest in S.T.E.M. or engineering field as a course for study
4. Recognized good academic and citizenship standing at current school

This is a renewable scholarship for tuition at Shrine Catholic High School, provided the student meets the requirements listed below.

Recipients of this scholarship must agree to the following requirements:

- Provide twice a year personal update/thank you to the Harbour Family
- Maintain in good standing academically (3.0 or above)
